


A Summer Day in the French Countryside: Sinead & Will



The top priority for this pair was to enjoy their day, "And not get too caught up by jobs or distractions," the couple explain "That's where the amazing staff at our venue came in – they managed every single detail so seamlessly and neither of us were any the wiser. Also our photographers did a wonderful job of capturing candid photos and then only whisked us away for a short period after the reception just before dinner. We also wanted to feel like we had enjoyed the day that we had planned – we wanted to taste the canapés, hear the music, see and talk to our guests!"



Keeping their wedding small also helped Sinéad and Will to maximise their day, "Every married couple tend to say how fast the day goes leaving little time to take in each detail you have carefully planned and to just enjoy the day. We managed our time by keeping our guestlist at an intimate 50 and picking the right venue where everything was on site. 


Guests enjoyed the sunshine with drinks and canapés in the courtyard - we love how the area is decked out with an abundance of festoon lights.






It's clear to see why Chateau des Carasses was a front-runner for these two, "It's a beautifully restored Chateau in the South of France, perched on a hillside, with vineyards all around. It looks exactly like, if not better than you would imagine when picturing a venue like this in your head. It also had enough accommodation on site for everyone and the quality of the finish and service is second to none."





The newlyweds' cracking advice for other couples? Spend time choosing the right venue, "Consider how your guests will get there, will you need caterers, does it include a coordinator and if so what exactly does that entail. We were very lucky with the venue, but equally if not more so with the staff at the venue. Our venue had a wedding planner service and florist included in the costs which meant that the cost was higher but, it means that they have lots of experience and recommendations for how to run a wedding in their venue. This takes some of the hassle out of the final stages of the wedding planning."





This jet-setting pair obviously planned a pretty epic honeymoon, "We travelled around Japan for a month which was amazing and a lifelong dream for both of us. As incredible as it was, travelling can be hard work and it would have been nice if we had given ourselves a week or so on a beach to relax after two years of planning a wedding!"
